What do you think is the greatest promise in the Bible?

Psalm 91 expresses the same truth regarding God's protection and provision — but for who?

¹He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty.

My Christian life is characterized by:

- a) Close communion/fellowship with God.
- b) Occasional fellowship with God.

²I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."

Now the Psalmist gets personal.

Have you ever thought to make v. 2 your life verse?

³Surely he will save you from the fowler's snare and from the deadly pestilence.

From what kind of "snare" has God saved you?

From what kind of "pestilence" has God saved you? What is the opposite of fear? ⁴He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart. What can we expect being "under His wings"? God is faithful — even when we are not. 5You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day, Do you sleep well? What are you anxious about? What do you worry about? "arrows" will come but... ⁶nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the plague that destroys at midday.

What "pestilence" or "plague" threatens you?

⁷A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you.

What part of v. 7 helps you?

⁸You will only observe with your eyes and see the punishment of the wicked.
